Notes for Servants

Objectives

Instruction

- (1) Review last week's lesson.
- (2) Remind the children about the church occasions for the coming week.

Story Time

Jesus was teaching people. They were all beside a lake. When evening came, Jesus said to His friends the Apostles, "Let's cross over to the other side of the lake." The Apostles got into a boat with Jesus. They left the crowd of people behind them. There were other boats on the lake.

Then, all of a sudden a strong wind began blowing. The boat rocked in the water. The big waves almost tipped the boat over. The Apostles were afraid. They thought the boat was going to sink and that they would drown. The Apostles looked around for Jesus. Jesus was sleeping through the storm. The Apostles called to Him, "Master, the boat is going to sink!" The wind seemed angry. It howled and made giant waves.

Jesus saw this when He woke up. "Quiet down," he said to the wind and water. "Be calm." Right away the wind stopped blowing. The sea became calm and peaceful again.

Jesus looked at His Apostles. "Why are you all so scared?" He asked them. "You should not fear anything, I am with you."
