# Communion

## Notes for Servants

- ★ Eating is one activity that joins all people. It is necessary to life, but do we remember that there are some families who cannot find that necessity?
- ★ As we partake of the body and the blood of Christ, do we consider His brothers and sisters, the needy, who are around us?

## Objectives

**General:** Communion is sharing Jesus' body and blood.

**Specific:**

The children will be able to ...

- A. Learn that Jesus loves us and lets us share His body and His blood.
- B. Understand that He wants us to be good as He is good to us.
- C. Know that as Jesus shares everything with us, we should share what we have with others.

## Bible Verse

**"Let little children come to me."**

Mark 10:14

## Teaching Aids

1. Picture of the last supper.
2. Felt Figures and flannel board.

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## Introduction

- (1) Review last week's lesson.
- (2) Remind the children about the church occasions for the coming week.
- (3) Teacher should prepare the appropriate questions to emphasize the objectives during the lesson.

## Story Time

Jesus spent a lot of time with His good friends, the Disciples. They visited many towns and cities. They travelled into the countryside. They went on boats together and of course they ate many meals together.

Sharing food with friends is a way of showing that we care about them. Remember how Jesus once fed all the people with only five loaves of bread and two fishes? That was a special time.

Jesus shared a special meal with the Disciples right before He died. They sat at a table together in an upstairs room in St. Mark's house in Jerusalem. It was a happy time because friends were together, but it was a sad time, too. Jesus told all His friends that this was the last supper He would have with them.

Then, Jesus picked up the bread and gave thanks for it. He broke it into pieces and gave it to His disciples. He said, "This is my body." Then, Jesus took the wine and said, "This is my blood." This was the Last Supper. The Disciples always remembered their last supper with Jesus.

Today, when people go to church and take part in communion, they remember what Jesus did. They remember Jesus as a friend who shared His food and Himself with us.

### Discussion

- 1 - Follow up the story by talking about it with the children.
- 2 - Teach the children that when we go for communion we must be quiet and stand in order forming one line and remembering that we are sharing Jesus' body and blood.
- 3 - Continue the discussion while they do the activity.
